



Monster Energy AMA Supercross Championship
2025 Supercross Team Guidelines

In addition to the specific guidelines set forth below, please be advised that Feld Motor Sports expressly reserves the right at all times to make any changes, additions or modifications to the below guidelines as it deems necessary in its reasonable discretion. All approvals and consents of Feld Motor Sports referenced in this document may be granted or withheld in its sole and absolute discretion. Additionally, any CoVID-19 Mitigation policies supersede all other guidelines contained within.

Part 1: Venue and Racetrack Specific Guidelines

I. ON TRACK CONDUCT

Access to the racetrack is a privilege. Conduct on and around the racetrack is outlined below.

- Respect the people around you. Including but not limited to: riders, team members, Feld staff, AMA staff, medical staff, flaggers, security staff, building staff, tv staff, and photographers. Foul language and disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated and may be subject to disciplinary action.
- Stay in approved areas at all times. NEVER cross track lanes when riders are on the track. (This includes after the checkered flag is thrown until the last bike is off the track)
- Mechanics must remain in the mechanic's area at all times while riders are on the track. At no time is a mechanic allowed out of the mechanic area to other portions of the track.

- Do not leave trash on the racetrack. Trash cans will be placed around the track at appropriate locations for disposal.
- No pictures or video may be taken from the track area without approved camera pass and appropriate photographers vest or video shirt.
- Never walk behind or stand behind heavy equipment
- Stay away and off the podium unless invited by the Supercross stage manager.
- Do not sit, stand or place items on tuff blocks or cover up track signage. (This includes hanging jackets or coats behind the start gate.)
- Open toe shoes and crutches will not be allowed on the track.
- Dark pants or team matching pants must be worn while on track.

II. TRESPASSING:

1. Any person caught trespassing without the proper credential or caught assisting someone to trespass on to venue property may be subject to prosecution under applicable laws.
2. Designated entrances must be used when entering the venue or paddock area.
3. Any person found breaking, climbing over, or opening the fence or otherwise entering the paddock area at a non-designated entrance gate will be subject to prosecution under applicable state and local laws.

III. CREDENTIALS:

1. Credentials must be worn at all times while in the paddock area, on the track, or within the venue.
2. **Your credential is your responsibility and is non-transferable. Persons violating this policy will be subject to removal from the venue and prosecution under applicable laws.**
3. **Any person who counterfeits, forges, or alters credentials (with the intent to defraud) is guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to prosecution under applicable laws.**
4. Feld Motor Sports reserves the right to revoke credentials at any time.
5. The only proper credentials are those issued by Feld Motor Sports as determined in its sole and absolute discretion.
6. Credentials must be worn and visible at all times by the individuals to whom the credentials were issued; and such credentials are not transferable and may not be distributed, given away or sold.
7. Any persons violating these policies shall be subject to immediate removal/eviction from the venue and may also be subject to prosecution under applicable laws.

IV. PRESS DAY

1. Press day will be Friday prior to each race.
2. Press day rotation will be provided by Feld Motor Sports's Public Relations Manager.
3. **Press day rules** are as follows:
 - a. Only approved and invited riders are allowed to ride during press day

- b. Anyone without a hard card credential must sign a release before entering the track
- c. Only riders and mechanics are permitted on the track. All others must go to venue seating area.
- d. Everyone permitted on the track must stay in the area designated by Feld Motor Sports.
- e. Crossing track lanes or standing in them is prohibited.
- f. No open toe shoes or crutches permitted on the track.
- g. Standing on the sides of jumps and berms is prohibited.
- h. Standing behind berms or near triple landings is prohibited.
- i. Sitting or standing in or on heavy equipment is prohibited.
- j. Riders can only ride parts of the track designated by Feld Motor Sports.

V. RADIO FREQUENCIES

All radio frequencies must be submitted to Feld Motor Sports prior to the first event a team participates in. This includes any radios, cameras, repeaters, or other devices that put off radio frequency. It is the team's responsibility to ensure they have legal rights to any radio frequencies in use. Some stadiums will monitor radio frequencies and not allow conflicting or illegal frequencies to be used.

VI. FACTORY FILMING

Factory Filming is a designated area where teams are allowed to film riders on the track with approved and permitted cameras only. This video is **ONLY** to be used for internal team R&D purposes and may **NOT** be used for any media, in anyway including social media for riders or race team.

This space is for **ACTIVELY** filming of riders only. No spectating will be allowed in this area. Only approved staff with approved video equipment are permitted. No guests are allowed at any time.

Requests for approved video equipment should be directed to Feld Motor Sports.

VII. PENALTIES: for venue and racetrack specific infractions

1. 1st violation of this conduct will usually result in a warning, however at Feld Motor Sports's sole discretion or due to the severity of a first violation any of the following consequences are possible: removal from track, credential revocation, and removal from the venue.
2. 2nd violation will result in immediate removal from the track area for the remainder of the event. When applicable credentials may be revoked.
3. 3rd violation will result in immediate removal from the track area and forfeit of one's credential.
4. Additional penalties may be imposed by the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA).

Part 2: Paddock Specific Guidelines

I. MERCHANDISE:

The distribution or sale of any merchandise, promotional items or marketing items is strictly prohibited without the prior written consent of Feld Motor Sports. This includes both physical sales and online ordering by teams or team affiliates.

II. TEAM SPACE AREA:

1. The Team Space (“Team Space”) is defined as the space in the paddock area of the event Venue (“Venue”) assigned to your team by Feld Motor Sports.
2. The dimensions of the team space are determined by the total length of your Team Transporter (“Team Transporter”) from the nose to the end of the lift gate and vehicle/awning width with the understanding that the length shall not exceed one hundred (100’) feet and the width shall not exceed thirty (30’) feet and the maximum height shall not exceed fourteen feet (14’). Use of additional space is prohibited without the prior written consent of Feld Motor Sports.
3. All team sponsor displays must be contained within your team space and behind team skirting. Awnings, umbrellas, ez-ups and other equipment may not be placed outside of your team space for any purpose including displaying, exhibiting or marketing team sponsors. Entry points into the team space may ONLY be permitted from the front (tractor) and rear (lift gate) of the vehicle and should only be accessible by team members and team guests.
4. Specific venues may require unique paddock layouts and may therefore limit the use of a team’s awnings, umbrellas, ez-ups and other equipment.
5. There shall only be one (1) Team Transporter permitted for each team. Additional transporters, straight trucks, fifth wheel trailers, box vans, hospitality units or other vehicles are prohibited without the prior written approval from Feld Motor Sports.
6. Specific venues have limited indoor paddock space which may result in certain team rigs and assets not being able to enter the paddock area during the event. This will be determined by Feld Motor Sports in its sole and absolute discretion.
7. Feld Motor Sports shall determine parking locations in its sole and absolute discretion, consistent with the following order: (1) Factory teams, (2) factory support teams, (3) 450SX class tractor trailer equipped teams based on Monster Energy Supercross points and ranking (first round parking based on previous year’s points), (4) 450SX class and 250SX class tractor trailer teams that have not scored points (based on length of participation in championship).
8. ALL competitor transport vehicles must have a 40BC class fire extinguisher in their approved pit area.
9. Bicycle barricades and portable restrooms ordered by Feld Motor Sports at each venue are for use by patrons only and will be dispersed where needed at the sole and absolute discretion of Feld Motor Sports. At no times should these be moved to an individual team space without prior approval from Feld Motor Sports.

10. Some Venues do not allow drilling, nailing or any type of penetration into the paddock surface. It is the team's responsibility to find an alternate system to hold down tents, flags, truss, and any other displays or equipment at these Venues. Teams will be informed of such locations in advance by Feld Motor Sports, however it is ultimately the team's responsibility to learn and abide by venue rules during the event.
11. All Team Transporter vehicles, where applicable, require a posted or hard copy certification that tents are flame retardant. Where applicable fire marshals will be onsite to inspect proofs of certification. Structures or trussing builds within Team Space (not including awning structures) may require a letter of structural stability. Fire marshal regulations and city permitting vary from Venue to Venue. Please contact Feld Motor Sports for local requirements. If these letters are not present or attached to your tent, the fire marshal may require your tent or structure to be taken down. All letters must be submitted to Feld Motor Sports no later than 30 days prior to your team's first event.
12. Paddock promotions and/or any activations must be submitted in advance to Feld Motor Sports for written approval. All requests must be submitted no later than 30 days prior to implementation. Promotions will not be allowed without express written permission from Feld Motor Sports.
13. Media-driven and social media driven promotions are subject to prior written approval of Feld Motor Sports.

III. TEAM SPONSORS:

1. All Team sponsors must comply with Federal, State and Local laws and at no time should a team sponsor be in direct conflict with any standing venue guidelines.
2. Team sponsorships by Firearms Manufacturers, Distributors, resellers or any firearm products including ammunition and firearm accessories are strictly prohibited.
3. Team sponsorships by tobacco or marijuana manufacturers, distributors, farms, or resellers regardless of medical or recreational purposes is strictly prohibited. This includes any person(s) or companies providing informational resources regarding the likeness.
4. Team sponsorships regarding any alcoholic products must be approved in advance by Feld Motor Sports no later than 30 days prior to the sponsorships first event.

IV. PROMOTIONAL ITEMS:

1. The distribution of any promotional or marketing items or products by teams, riders or team sponsors is strictly prohibited without the prior written approval of Feld Motor Sports. All requests must be submitted to Feld Motor Sports no later than 30 days prior to the promotion's first event.
2. The distribution of coupons and/or bags bearing the team name is allowed but may only include logos within the team name. All artwork on any such bags shall be subject to the prior written approval of Feld Motor Sports.
3. Stickers are strictly prohibited.
4. Team or sponsor mascots, models, brand ambassadors, spokespersons and any other persons representing your team, or any sponsor are only allowed within the confines of

the team space; none of the foregoing will be admitted to the venue without the prior written approval of Feld Motor Sports.

V. HOSPITALITY / CATERING ACTIVITIES:

1. Catering activities are subject to the prior approval of Feld Motor Sports in its sole and absolute discretion and are also subject to applicable venue regulations governing such activities and if approved, shall be performed at the sole cost and expense of the team. Moreover, the team must utilize the venue's designated caterer for any such catering or related hospitality activities, unless specific permission is provided to the team by Feld Motor Sports.
2. Within the team space only, food and non-alcoholic beverages may only be served to team guests that possess appropriate credentials as provided by Feld Motor Sports.
3. No food or beverages of any kind may be distributed or served to spectators, fans, or other individuals not specified in the paragraph above without the prior written approval of Feld Motor Sports.
4. Any on-site food preparation must meet all applicable local, state or federal guidelines and health code regulations and teams shall be strictly responsible for fully complying with all such regulations.
5. If teams are permitted to engage in any catering activities, such teams shall do so with the understanding and agreement that they must indemnify, defend and hold Feld Motor Sports harmless with respect to any and all claims, lawsuits, and causes of actions and/or damages, including reasonable attorneys' fees arising out of or in connection with any of sponsors' catering or sampling activities.
6. All hospitality activities shall be contained at all times within the team space area specifically designated by Feld Motor Sports for such activities.

VI. POST RACE PRESS CONFERENCE

1. Each rider competing in the series of heat races, LCQ's and Main Events may have the opportunity to be invited to the post-race press conference. Attending the post-race press conference is mandatory for any rider invited as requested by Feld Motor Sports. Failure to appear for the post-race press conference could result in credential revocation, in addition to any penalties imposed by the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA).
2. In addition, the team managers and/or mechanics for each rider may also be requested to participate in this post race press conference.
3. A representative from Feld Motor Sports will notify all riders and personnel required at the post race press conference.

VII. TEAM VEHICLES / MOTOR COACHES / RIDER SUPPORT:

1. Each original equipment manufacturer ("OEM") will be allowed to designate two (2) teams to have one (1) car, truck or other motor vehicle per team, which may be used for team personnel transportation and/or display (the "team vehicle") and one bus, RV or other motor coach to be used as rider housing ("motor coach"), each to be parked within the team space provided. A maximum of two (2) team vehicles per OEM are allowed.

All team vehicles and motor coaches must have appropriate graphics as approved by Feld Motor Sports.

2. No rental cars, team transporters, vehicles, likeness of a vehicle including simulators, body frames or any other representations of a team vehicle other than those designated by the OEM in accordance with these guidelines may be displayed in the paddock area without the prior written approval of Feld Motor Sports. FELD MOTOR SPORTS RESERVES THE RIGHT IN ITS ABSOLUTE AND SOLE DISCRETION TO TOW UNAUTHORIZED VEHICLES IN THE PADDOCK SPACE.
3. Vehicles cannot display a “Window MSRP Sticker” at any time.
4. Vehicles must remain locked with all doors closed while the public is permitted in paddock area, during open pit hours. The hood and trunk of each vehicle must also remain closed.
5. Parking within the venue parking lot will not be free of charge.
6. Staging is prohibited within the venue parking lot without prior approval from Feld Motor Sports. Pre-staging is not permitted at the venue prior to the date given in the weekly informational email and staging at some venues may be limited or unavailable in the days preceding the event, and venues may choose to impose fines for improperly parked vehicles.
7. Feld Motor Sports will provide each OEM-designated team with a paddock pass for that team’s vehicle. The paddock pass must be displayed prominently on the team vehicle at all times while in paddock.
8. Team vehicles must display prominent team logos similar to those displayed on the Team Transporter.
9. At certain venues Select factory rider and sponsor motor coaches, tour buses and RV’s will be parked in a separate compound located next to the paddock area and accessible to the paddock area as designated by Feld Motor Sports in its sole discretion.
10. All vehicles parked in the separate compound or paddock area must vent the generator exhaust to the top of their unit.
11. Any vehicles transporting a race motorcycle and being used as a pit vehicle will be issued a hang tag upon entry to the paddock on a weekly basis and checked against the Ama entry list.
12. This hang tag will permit you in and out privileges of the paddock for the event. No vehicle movement will be allowed 1 hour prior to fan fest opening to the public.
13. Vehicles that are not hauling a race bike but need to drop off supplies and/or equipment to your pit will be given a 15 minute window to do so. This vehicle will be issued a temporary pass and must vacate the paddock after 15 minutes. If this vehicle is left in the paddock after 15 minutes the vehicle is subject to being towed at the owner’s expense
14. **Starting in 2025 All motorhomes will not be allowed inside of the paddock, instead they will be parked in an auxiliary lot
15. Approved Paddock Vehicles will receive an APV sticker in advance of the season. All non-approved rental vehicles must be parked outside the paddock.

VIII. DISTRIBUTION OF AUTOGRAPH MATERIALS / AUTOGRAPH SESSIONS:

1. Teams may distribute autograph materials that consist of team posters, team cards, or team pictures.

2. Autograph materials must have prominent team logo included.
3. Autograph materials must be solely related to the team which may include team sponsors' logos with such materials.
4. No "sponsor only" related autograph material may be distributed at any time by the team or team sponsors.
5. Autograph materials may have team sponsors' coupon printed on the posters.
6. Riders must be made available to sign autographs for the spectators in the paddock area or on the concourse, depending on the venue, during the early entry period for a minimum of 30 Minutes (typically 12:00pm-6:00pm. Early entry and open pit hours may vary depending on the event.).

IX. PADDOCK HOURS / TIMES / PARKING

1. Working team crew Paddock hours (Subject to change)
 - Thursday 8:00am-5:00pm
 - Friday 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 p.m.
 - No Re-entry after 11:00 p.m. on Fridays
 - Saturday 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 a.m.
2. Team Transporter parking:
 - Parking will be split up between Thursday & Friday.
 - Thursday Parking will include all teams on Early Morning Press on Fridays.
 - Friday Parking will include all other teams that are on Afternoon Press on Friday.
 - Anyone arriving after 5:00 pm Friday will have to wait until 8:00 am Saturday morning to be parked in the paddock area.
 - All team transporters and drivers must be staged and available to park in the pre-determined staging lot designated by Feld Motor Sports no later than 7:55am Thursday morning. Transporters may forfeit their pre-determined parking space if they are not ready for parking at 8am

X. SIDE BY SIDES/ QUADS – APPROVED PADDOCK VEHICLES (APV'S):

- 1. Riders must use bike lanes to traverse to/from track where provided. Failure to use bike lanes may result in penalties from the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA)**
2. Select teams will be granted the privilege to use an APV (approved paddock vehicle).
3. Any APV must display an APV sticker provided by Feld Motor Sports.
4. APV's must be used for work purposes only - food, equipment, crew, and rider transportation.
5. All APV's must be shut down and stored in the team space during open paddock hours ('the curfew'). APV use may resume after the paddock has been cleared of general admission fans.
6. Feld Motor Sports reserves the right to revoke APV stickers and to prohibit the use of such vehicle within the paddock area if the vehicle is used in a manner deemed unsafe by Feld Motor Sports or if the curfew is violated.

7. Specific venues may require unique paddock layouts and may therefore limit the use of APV's.

XI. GENERAL Paddock RESTRICTIONS

1. Drones are prohibited at all times within the paddock, venue and surrounding properties.
2. Razor's's, Bicycles, Hoverboards, Skateboards and all other wheeled conveyances as decided by Feld Motor Sports are not to be in operation during open paddock hours.
3. All product displays and or materials must comply with all local, state and federal laws. It is the responsibility of each team to know and ensure all laws are followed. This includes but is not limited to CBD Oils, Fuels, Energy Drinks, Etc.

XII. TRASH / FUEL / OIL / COOLANT DUMPING:

1. All trash must be disposed of in approved containers in accordance with applicable laws.
2. The dumping of fuel, motor oil, coolant, grey water, and black water in the paddock area or on the venue property is strictly prohibited and violators are subject to immediate eviction from both the paddock area and the venue and may be subject to prosecution under applicable laws.
3. Certain venues may prohibit the washing of bikes, trailers and other equipment. It is each team's responsibility to determine and fully comply with such venue rules and regulations.
4. There will be a dedicated wash station at all rounds of Supercross in 2025. Failure to comply with utilizing this wash station will result in penalties as deemed in XIII in this paddock guideline document.
5. Certain venue regulations may require you to use the approved fuel depot area in accordance with the local fire marshal and any such regulation must be complied with in every respect. All containers must be marked with rider's team name or number. All containers must be removed from the fuel depot by 11:00pm Saturday. Containers left at the fuel depot are subject to a fine and fee for hazmat disposal. Violator's may be subject to prosecution under applicable laws.
6. Certain Venue regulations may require the local fire marshal to inspect team transporters for approved fuel containers or drums. All containers must be in accordance with state or local regulations. Each team must fully cooperate at all times with local fire marshal. Failure to fully comply with the local fire marshal may subject violators to prosecution under applicable laws.

XIII. PENALTIES: for paddock guideline infractions

1. 1st offense will result in a written warning to the team referencing the guideline(s) violated.
2. 2nd offense will result in placement of team and all related vehicles and equipment at the back of the paddock area for the next event following such violation.
3. 3rd offense will result in the placement of team and all related vehicles and equipment in the back of the paddock area for the next three (3) events following violation.
4. 4th offense will result in the placement of team and all related vehicles and equipment in

the back of the paddock area for the remainder of the season, and team sponsor activations/displays of any type at the new location will not be permitted for the remainder of the season.

5. Additional fines and/or penalties may be imposed by the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA)
